Portfolio Update:

- KKC delivered a -0.06% return in August. High Yield Bonds outperformed Loans over the month and CCC and B assets drove performance across asset classes.
- The weighted average price of the underlying KKC assets in the portfolio stood at 99.1% of par as at month end. The Yield to Maturity, which is inversely related to prices, stood at 9.2% and the current yield of the underlying assets in the portfolio was 8.4%(3).
 - European Direct Lending (EDL) had no new additions during the month. There were two realisations, an Italian pharmaceutical company and a German construction & Engineering company. EDL represents ~40% of KKC's portfolio invested as at month end. A case study on one of our EDL deals can be found on page 3.

Distribution Update⁽²⁾:

KKC declared a monthly distribution of A\$0.0167 which equates to an annualised yield of 8.26% based on NTA and 8.46% based on the ASX unit price as of 31 August 2025. This is in line with the FY26 distribution estimate of A\$0.20.

Market Update:

August marked a significant cooling in the loan market following July's record-breaking performance. Despite this pullback, August's volume still set a historical high for the traditionally slow summer month. High yield bonds posted their fifth consecutive monthly gain, returning +1.22%⁽⁸⁾ as the market priced in a potential September rate cut and spreads tightened. Loans returned +0.45%⁽⁹⁾ in August, though CCC rated loans came under pressure following a jump in the CCC par default rates. While loan CCCs retreated, high yield CCCs topped the leaderboard, causing CCC-rated loan over high yield spread premium to surge.

Portfolio Case Study

Company Overview

- Ambassador Theatre Group ("ATG") is the world's largest theatre operator with 71 venues across the United Kingdom, United States, Germany and Spain with iconic theatres based in landmark districts in the West-End and Broadway.
- ATG owns & operates many of the world's most well-known theatres (incl. the Apollo & Lyceum in London and Lyric & St. James Theatre on Broadway) and houses ~17,000 performances annually
- ATG has been majority-owned by Providence Equity since 2013 (acquired at ~£350m EV / 11.7x EBITDA) and in this period ATG has grown significantly via both organic levers and M&A (+36% EBITDA CAGR since 2018, o/w 19% organic).

Transaction Overview

- In 2020, Providence sold a minority stake of ~15% in ATG to TEG, an Australian entertainment business and moved ATG to a continuation fund with~\$800 million cash equity injected.
- In 2024, Blackstone & QIA acquired minority stakes in ATG from TEG & Providence at a ~£2.7 billion valuation, reflecting a ~13x multiple, and injected ~£700 million in cash equity. We estimate that Providence currently holds less than \$100 million in cash equity in the business today.
- In April 2025, ATG decided to refinance its existing private credit financing with a £1.3 billion-equivalent Term Loan B (split between GBP, EUR, USD), including a £400 million private tranche, in which KKR Credit committed £150 million.
- Our investment thesis was predicated on ATG's (i) leading market position and strong brand portfolio with 71 venues, including 17 venues in key areas such as the West-End and Broadway; (ii) strong geographic diversification across the US, UK and Europe; (iii) strong base of existing shows with no dependence on any single show or theatre; and (iv) significant value cover from close to £1 billion of freehold properties across the UK and US based on historical book value.

KKC Overview

The Trust aims to provide investors with attractive, risk-adjusted returns and access to a diversified portfolio of income generating alternative credit investments through the Trust's investment across strategies managed by the credit investment teams of Kohlberg Kravis Roberts & Co. L.P. ("KKR").

These strategies comprise the Global Opportunistic Credit strategy and European Direct Lending strategy, which seek to take advantage of the attractive opportunities that KKR sees in the market. The Trust's investment objective is to provide an income stream as well as to achieve attractive long-term capital appreciation over a full market cycle.

KKC has announced that for the financial year ending June 2026, KKC is targeting a distribution of A\$0.0167 per month or A\$0.20 per annum⁽²⁾. At the current NTA of A\$2.43 per unit, that represents an annual distribution yield of 8.26%⁽²⁾. The Trust continues to target a medium-term average total return of 6% - 8% per annum⁽⁵⁾ through business cycles.

The Trust is appropriate for investors seeking income distribution to be used as a satellite allocation within a portfolio where the investor has a 5+ year investment timeframe and a medium to high risk/return profile.
